The project aims to develop a systematic method to identify potential archaeological sites in the Al Ba'aj region of Iraq through Machine Learning techniques and remote sensing. Through the combination of commercial and declassified satellite images and algorithm-based functions, we aim at mapping a totally uncharted area of North Mesopotamia. Future research and the monitoring of the local cultural heritage are the main objectives of the project. The collaboration of academic institutions and private companies is an added value to the AASIDUM project.

CliVAnIL Project: Climate Variability and Ancient Imperial Landscapes. An Eastern Mediterranean and Global Perspective (Assyria to Islam)

This project I intend to submit to several funding agencies deals with the spatial imperial transformation (from Assyria to Islam) in consequence of changed climatic and environmental conditions. I plan to cross-check multiple datasets (archaeology, textual evidence, paleo-environmental records) to explore shift in settlement patterns, modes of subsistence, and economic activities in the Age of Empires in the Eastern Mediterranean and the Near East.
