Abstract:

Coding theory is the study of reliable communication over unreliable channels, including storage channels. This talk will give a brief overview of directions in modern coding theory, focusing particularly on coding problems inspired by the structure of flash memory storage devices. After an introduction to classical coding theory and the flash memory problem, we will show how rewriting codes can be obtained using finite geometries.

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
